This workshop is most suitable for intermediate to advanced watercolorists. Daily demonstrations will help guide you on techniques and ways to improve as an artist.

Learn how to create strong paintings through sketching, dynamic under-paintings, use of rich color, stressing high contrast in value, shape and color temperature, and infusing your painting with style and emotion.

Mr. Dunn was the department chairman at the Academy of Art University in San Francisco and is currently a member of both the American and National Watercolor Societies.








